First Pigs at DRWF Islet Resource Facility

In mid-February, after thorough cleaning and decontamination, we brought our first piglets into the facility. The animals originated from our animal unit in Huron, South Dakota, a unit that we operate together with the Hutterian Brethren Riverside Colony under the leadership of John Waldner. Diagnostic tests showed that these healthy pigs delivered were free of infectious pathogens and disease. We are grateful to the dedicated team under the leadership of Mike Martin (Director Facility) and Adrienne Schucker (Director Veterinary Medicine) at the facility for their impressive work to make this possible so shortly after the opening.

Since that time, a number of animal groups have been delivered. By the end of June there were about 60 animals in the facility, healthy and disease-free. Thus, we are well on track in our pig production program to have donors available for islet cell transplants in two years!
